Doosan Forklift Part - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is a transnational organization consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry products, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Technologies and Machine Tools and Computerization Systems.

In the U.S.A., Doosan Infracore America Corporation is headquartered in Suwanee, Georgia. It is home to a 170,000 square foot manufacturing facility, which is the home of the Compact Equipment and Construction department. West Caldwell, New Jersey is home to the Machine Tool division and Cleveland, Bellevue is home to the Forklift division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction customer needs.

With a network consisting of over 90 autonomous sellers, the forklift group supplies quality materials handling equipment to the wide-ranging North American market. Doosan Infracore America Lift Truck sellers successfully operate in over 220 service and sales places all through Canada and the U.S. The lift truck product line impressively comprises of 63 distinctive products consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion lift trucks. Capacities of these various truck models range from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are designed in an ISO 9001 certified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest growing forklift and lift truck corporation in the North American marketplace, thanks to its outstanding level of product performance and their consistently high level of buyer support and service given to all Doosan Infracore Lift Truck users. The U.S. forklift division stationed in Cleveland has a professional team experienced in Product Sales, Purchasing, Advertising, Logistical and Technical Support.

In the beginning the home-based forklift market in Korea was an open import enterprise. Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. started in 1960, to import fully assembled forklifts as part of a home-based machinery expansion project. Sales of these goods were originally targeted to state-run companies, large scale businesses, and the armed forces. This eventually led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division commenced trade operations throughout Korea to overhaul and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a lift truck production plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical training grew to become the new focus for improving quality and product development.

Domestic lift truck business for Daewoo started in 1967 and grew to an amazing 90% market share in Korea. By the 1980's, Daewoo's advanced technological improvements combined with sales success placed them in a situation of substantial growth of their lift truck operations.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a joint enterprise project to respond to competitive pressures in the US materials handling industry. This project drastically expanded Daewoo's forklift sales. Construction was completed in 1984 to facilitate a contemporary plant which helped establish the business for the manufacture of high end added-value goods suitable for export. In 1993, the corporation had a international sales system and started exporting designs they had established through in-house technology, as an sovereign product. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing growth opportunities into international markets.
